Welcome back! We hope you had a good time over the Christmas break and you're ready for the challenges of this term in Year 5 and 6!



Our key question for our topic this term is 'How did the Victorian period help to shape the Sharlston we know today?'

Through this work, children will develop knowledge, skills and understanding in relation to Sharlston's History and how it was influenced by the Victorian Era and its mining heritage. They will have multiple cross-curricular opportunities to explore this topic including:

- · Creating artwork focusing on the artist William Morris
- Comparing present day Sharlston with the area during the Victorian Period
 - Working as a historian to interpret historical sources
 Researching mining and the impact of the miners' strike on Sharlston

Our science topics this term are 'Light' and 'Electricity'.



The topics will provide opportunities to work scientifically, whilst also linking to our current key questions 'How can a coal miner see down a coal mine?' and 'How does electricity help the miners?'





Working on Teams

A daily timetable will be posted on the general channel of the class Teams page every day to outline the schedule for the day's learning.

We have our daily Meet & Greet at 9am. This enables us to discuss the previous day's lessons and respond to any questions. We can then talk through the expectations for the day's learning and clarify the children's understanding before they embark on their lessons
