<p>Our progressive geography curriculum includes world knowledge of locations, places and geographical features. It also allows children to develop a working knowledge of specific significant places and physical processes, and how these are important over time. Throughout the geography curriculum, children will have the opportunity to collect, analyse, evaluate and investigate data through the use of fieldwork.</p> <p>Cross curricular links will encourage children to be inquisitive about where a place is in the world and its human and physical features in relation to the local area.</p>	<p>Children will develop an understanding of citizenship of people from around the world. By studying different cultures, they will discover the similarities and differences between them and how human and physical features influence different cultures lives. As well as focusing on the wider world, children will also explore their immediate surroundings through the use of field work where they will study how land is used and transport in the area.</p> <p>By engaging in eco activities, children will understand the difference they can make at home, locally and globally.</p>	<p>Throughout the geography curriculum, children will be introduced to and become familiar with vocabulary around place, process and issues such as global warming.
